Day 1



Akwaaba—Welcome Home, Beautiful Soul!

Akwaaba—welcome home! Land in Ghana's vibrant capital before 3 PM and look for the sign with your name on it. Ghana, the first African nation to gain independence, has been welcoming us back with open arms through the Year of Return and beyond. Check in at the Kempinski at three, then the early evening holds a tailor appointment for anyone who wants custom pieces made for the week. Tonight is all black: a chef-curated dinner on a rooftop above one of Accra's tallest buildings, the whole city lit up below. The glow-up starts now.

Day 2



Historical Accra—Markets, Monuments and DuBois

Breakfast at the Kempinski, then the city itself. We start in Accra's beating heart, through local markets loud with new smells, tastes and colour. On to the Kwame Nkrumah Mausoleum and Memorial Park, where Ghana's first president rests and where the story of independent Africa begins. Then Black Star Square and the Independence Arch, both built by that first democratic government, and a political past laid out in concrete and bronze. Lunch is Ghanaian and generous. The afternoon belongs to the W.E.B. DuBois Centre, the estate where the civil rights leader spent his final years and is buried. If you want custom pieces made, the optional tailor experience runs first thing this morning.

Day 3



Soft Life Energy—Beach Club Goals

A slow morning, breakfast at the hotel, and an 11:30 departure for an afternoon at an exclusive beachfront club. Swim, sunbathe, and sip cocktails made with local flavours while the Atlantic does its thing in front of you. One honest note: this is a vibey beach club, not a swimming beach. The sand here collects trash and debris, so the ocean stays scenery. Lunch and dinner today are yours to choose. This is the soft life, Ghana edition. You earned this.

Day 4



The Door of No Return—Honoring Our Story

An early one, and worth it. Breakfast boxes, coffee and juice in the lobby at 5:50, wheels up at six, everyone in white. First is Assin Manso, where a traditional naming ceremony gives you your Ghanaian name, a symbol of acceptance and belonging. Then Donkor Nsuo, the slave river, where captives were allowed to bathe before a three-week trek through dense forest to the coast. Lunch in Cape Coast, where the flavours of the sea meet Ghanaian cooking. In the afternoon we walk Cape Coast Castle: the dungeons, and the Door of No Return, the last frontier between those dungeons and the ships waiting at the port. The ride back to Accra is quiet. It should be.

Day 5



Bean to Bar—Chocolate, Lunch and the Arts Centre

Ghana is one of the world's great cocoa countries, and this morning you go hands-on with it: three hours of chocolate making, from bean to bar, with the story of the country's cocoa industry folded in. A late traditional lunch follows, vibrant and generous, the food this city is built on. Then the Arts Centre, a hub for Ghanaian art and craftsmanship, where you can talk to the artisans and take home kente, carved masks and handmade textiles. Your suitcase won't be ready.

Day 6



Choose Your Adventure—Waterfalls or Chill

Today offers space for whatever calls to you. Book the optional excursion and you leave at 7 AM, because the drive to the falls is three hours: Boti Waterfalls for a swim in the forest, then Aburi Botanical Gardens and its shaded paths of indigenous and exotic planting. It is booked and paid separately from the trip. Or stay in Accra: roam the city, book a spa treatment, journal about the week and let everything sink in. Sometimes the most powerful moments are the quiet ones.

Day 7

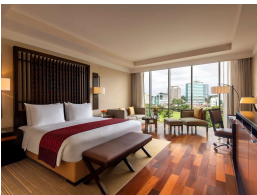


Cooking Class—Jollof, Properly

The day is yours until four, when we leave the hotel for a cooking class with a local chef. Over three hours you work through the canon: jollof rice, the blended tomato, pepper and onion base and the smoky finish that sets the Ghanaian version apart; red red, the black-eyed pea stew with palm oil and fried plantain; ampesi, boiled yam and plantain with garden egg stew; and omo tuo, rice balls rolled by hand for groundnut soup. Then you sit down and eat what you made, family-style, the way it is done in Ghanaian homes. And yes, Ghana's jollof hits harder. Sorry, Nigeria.

Day 8



Until We Return, Family!

A last breakfast at the Kempinski, then your private driver takes you to Kotoka International Airport for your flight home. Departures are any time after 8 AM, so most mornings are short ones. Make no mistake, though—you're not leaving the same person who arrived. You carry a new name, new connections, and the unshakeable knowledge that home was always here waiting. Until we return.

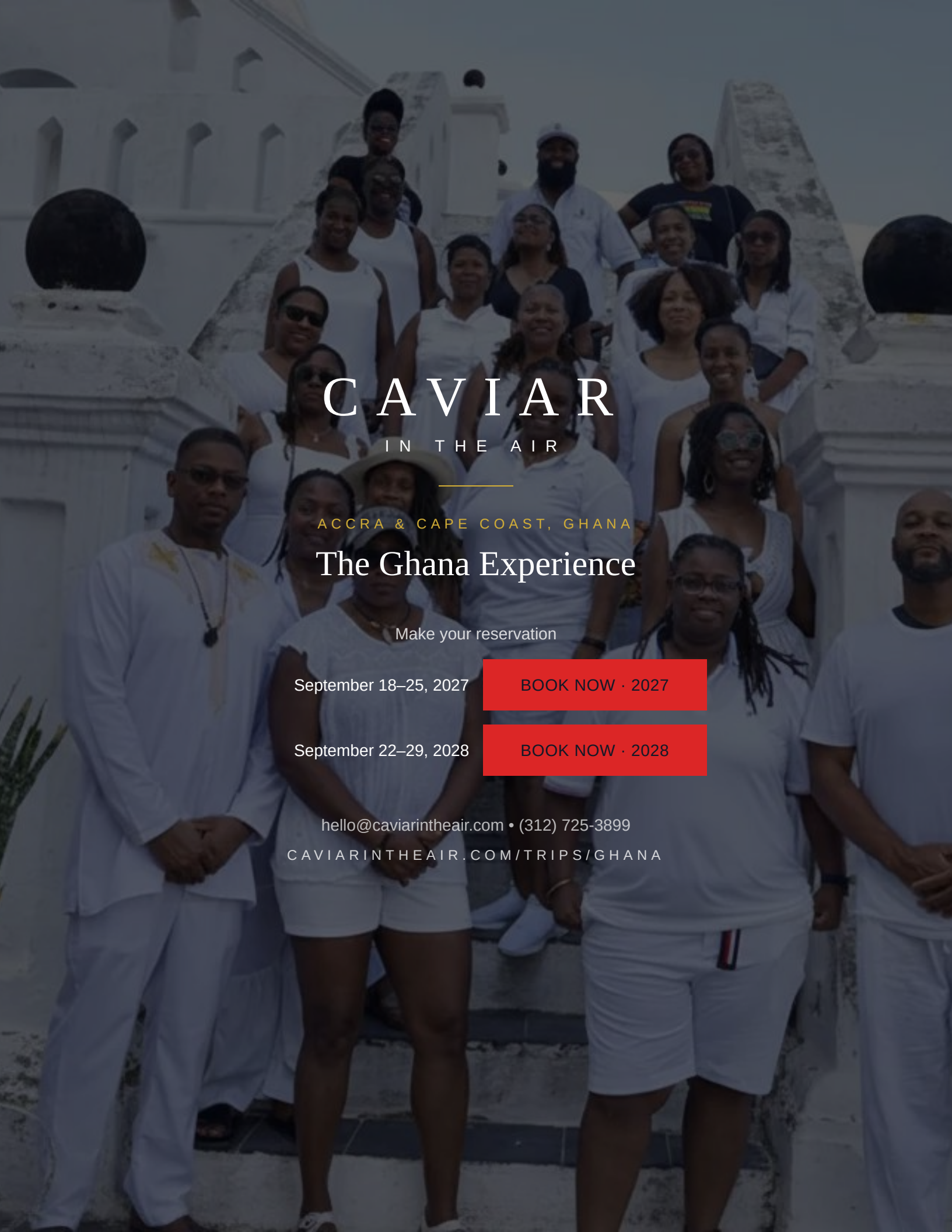
